If I could, I would first prescribe Hope for all cancer patients, way before chemo, surgery or radiation. But you can not write prescription for Hope or get it filled at a pharmacy.

It takes a great instinct and effort for any one to feel Hopeful in difficult times and it takes even greater instinct for an oncology provider to give Hope to their patients every single day as part of their job.

Nobody is taught in school how to give Hope. It comes from one's heart.....”.
